This is an English speaking and listening class for international teaching assistants. The course will provide systematic practice in three areas of spoken English relevant to classroom instruction:

- * English pronunciation
- * English used in making classroom presentations
- * English used in "class management"

The class will meet four and a half hours per week for ten weeks with the instructor. Additionally, students can meet pronunciation tutors to practice outside the class time. We will arrange schedules starting the second week.

The final class grade will be "P" (pass) or "NP" (no pass). To obtain a "P", students must complete all homework assignments satisfactorily and have no more than 4 unexcused absences. On November 20 students with a "P" will take the English Language Center's ITA Oral Interview. Students who pass the interview, satisfy MSU's TA English requirement and are cleared for teaching.

Students who do not complete all homework assignments or who have more than four unexcused absences will receive a class grade of "NP" and not be permitted to take the ITA Oral Interview. Being 10 minutes late to three classes will count as an absence. Students must return their books to the TA Office before they can take the ITA Oral Interview.
