At the start of International Education Week (IEW), ELC faculty gathered at a gala celebrating the 150th anniversary of Michigan State University's (MSU) first international students. This event set a celebratory tone for the week of November 13-17, 2023, during which MSU honored International Education Week (IEW), a nationwide initiative endorsed by the U.S. Department of State and the U.S. Department of Education. The week underscored the critical importance of global engagement in education, in line with MSU's mission to advance knowledge and transform lives through international experiences.

The week commenced with a virtual reality session at MSU Libraries, offering attendees the opportunity to digitally explore various global landscapes. ### **ELC Hosts Teacher Education Summit**

The 2023 Teacher Education Summit, hosted by MSU's English Language Center, offered a comprehensive platform for former participants of the PDPI (Programa de Desenvolvimento Profissional para Professores de Língua Inglesa nos EUA) program. Administered by the Institute of International Education (IIE), PDPI is a pivotal initiative by the Brazilian government aimed at enhancing English language teaching and teacher training across Brazil. This six-week program brings high school English teachers to U.S. universities for advanced study in English language and teaching methodologies, alongside immersion in U.S. society and culture.

Held on September 30 from 11:00 AM to 7:00 PM Brasilia Time, the summit featured a series of workshops, keynote addresses, and interactive sessions led by ELC faculty and other distinguished educators. Topics such as technology integration, inclusive teaching strategies, and culturally responsive pedagogy were emphasized, addressing crucial aspects of contemporary education.
